THE 2008-2009 FRIENDSHIP FUND – A TRADITION OF GIVING

On January 5, 1981, the Friendship Fund received its first gift from Texas Beta Hattie Stokes Wootters. With that first gift, Hattie started a tradition of giving to the Friendship Fund which she continued for 20 years until her death in 1999. Included with Hattie’s last gift to the Friendship Fund was a note that read: “At the age of 97, I look back with pride and love to Pi Phi friends who have meant so much to me through the years.”

What is the Friendship Fund anyway?
 The Friendship Fund is the Foundation’s annual fund and major fundraising program. It is composed of unrestricted gifts. Gifts to the Friendship Fund help support the Foundation’s scholarship program, grants to the Fraternity and to its members for education and leadership development and grants to Pi Beta Phi philanthropies. Pi Phis, collegiate chapters, alumnae groups and friends support the Friendship Fund. The 2008-2009 Friendship Fund annual appeal kicked-off in September 2008.

Champions Are Readers® (CAR) \$8,400

CAR is a reading enrichment program for third graders. The program can be

used for one classroom or several and is designed to complement other local literacy programs that a club or chapter may direct. CAR improves reading skills, instills a lifelong love of reading and promotes family literacy.

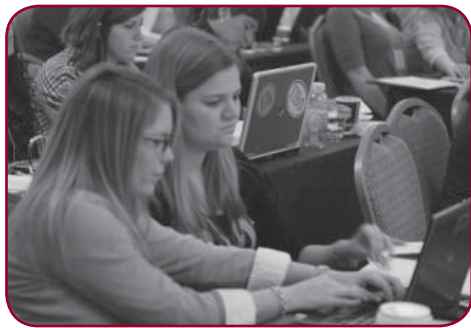
Leadership Development Consultant (LDC) Program \$50,000

The LDC program is a full-time job beginning in July and ending in April of the following year. As ambassadors and leaders for the Fraternity, LDCs visit

Leadership Academy

\$24,000

The conference program consists of a series of high-impact leadership courses designed to hone specific leadership skills by developing effective management techniques. Financial forums are specifically designed for the vice president finance and address all aspects of chapter finances.

Undergraduate Interfraternity Institute (UIFI) Scholarships

\$3,045

UIFI, a five-day journey, offers participants the opportunity to explore, define and enhance their leadership skills, personal awareness and their commitment to their fraternity or sorority.



Fraternity Day of Service

\$10,000

This annual Fraternity-wide event takes place in March and unites Pi Phi's membership in an effort to advance literacy. Chapters and clubs raise funds and/or books through service events benefitting their communities. In 2008, Pi Phi partnered with First Book® for a Make Your Mark for Literacy campaign, raising another 50,000 books. The 50,000 new books were added to the Fraternity's 200,000 books distributed in Pi Beta Phi's name on Founders' Day, April 28, 2008.

Leading with Values®

\$4,000

Through the framework of *Leading with Values*, Pi Beta Phi fulfills a commitment to give all members meaningful opportunities and support based on those values and the pursuit of lifelong growth objectives. This program sets the stage for understanding and living the values of the Fraternity, fulfilling leadership potential, serving others and achieving academic excellence. The four cornerstones of the *Leading with Values* program: organizational knowledge, good citizenship, intellectual development and leadership development.

First Book®

\$125,000

The Foundation granted half of the \$250,000 needed for Pi Beta Phi Fraternity's corporate sponsorship of First Book. In June 2007, Pi Beta Phi announced its corporate partnership with First Book, an international nonprofit organization founded in 1992 with a single mission: to give children of low-income families the opportunity to read and own their first new books. Together, through innovative programs such as First Book Speed Read™ and the Virtual Book Drive, First Book and Pi Beta Phi are committed to bringing new books to children of low-income families in communities across the United States and Canada. Emma Harper Turner (EHT) Fund

\$39,850

The Emma Harper Turner (EHT) Fund is the Pi Beta Phi Foundation's philanthropic fund that provides one-time grants or monthly stipends to initiated members in grave financial need. Gifts are given to alumnae in dire financial need, alumnae who are continuing their education due to extreme circumstances and for the educational expenses of collegians who have experienced a life change that jeopardizes their ability to stay in school. The EHT Fund also assists members residing in presidentially declared disaster areas with disaster relief funding. The EHT program is strictly confidential.



Chapter Leadership Education Endowments (CLEEs)

\$19,464.20

CLEEs fund portions of chapter presidents' attendance at conventions and leadership training workshops. Remaining funds may be applied to the qualifying cost of additional chapter and/or Alumnae Advisory Committee members' attendance and then to the cost of chapter programs or speakers on qualifying topics.

Arrowmont scholarships are available to both members and non-members of Pi Beta Phi for the Arrowmont School of Arts and Crafts spring and summer sessions.
